IN CASE OF A BARBECUE FIRE

- For propane Grills-turn off the burners. If you can safely reach the tank valve, shut it off.
- For Charcoal Grills close the grill lid
- If the fire involves the tank, leave it alone, evacuate the area and call the fire department (911).
- NEVER attempt to extinguish a grease fire with water. It will only cause the flames to flare an approved portable fire up. extinguisher.

Barbecuing Safely

Barbecue season is here! There are a few things to watch out for when cooking outdoors so that you enjoy yourself and stay safe.

- California fire code prohibits charcoal barbecues and other open-flame cooking devices to be operated on combustible balconies or within 10 feet of combustible construction.
- On combustible balconies, decks or patios that do not have 10 feet clearance, use an electric grill or a propane gas grill with a container capacity of less than 2.5 lbs. IT'S THE LAW!
- Ensure that your barbecue is sound and in good working order. Check for leaks, cracking or brittleness before using.
- Keep your grill clean and free of buildup that may lead to a fire.
- Never us a barbecue indoors as this a dangerous fire hazard and can cause high levels of carbon monoxide.
- Open the lid before turning on the gas or lighting it.
- Have a fire extinguisher, a garden hose attached to a water supply, or at least 16 quarts of water close by in case of a fire.
- Never use any flammable liquid other than a barbecue starter fluid to start or freshen a fire.
- Keep alcoholic beverages away from the grill, they are flammable!
- Never leave the grill unattended.

The consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) reports that more than 500 fires and 20 injuries occur every year from gas grill fires and explosions of grills that have not been used for several months.

We look forward to Spring/Summer when all our flowers are in bloom and looking beautiful. However, we have noted that flowers


are being picked and plants are being damaged. Please instruct all members of your household to NOT pick flowers. Flowers are to be left so that everyone can enjoy them.
