Qualifications:

- Bidding will start at \$240.00
- Unit owner must be current on monthly dues.
- Winners must forfeit common area parking space and will only be allowed to park in your 2 carports.
- Winner must pay by check made payable to "The Redwoods HOA". An NSF check will disqualify that winner and the carport will go to the second highest bidder.
- Tenants must have written authorization from the owner of the unit to be eligible to bid

 Don't leave valuables on your patio or balcony.

To Avoid Plumbing Stoppages


Many residents will be cooking Thanksgiving dinner. One thing that will interfere with a nice Thanksgiving dinner is a backed up kitchen sink!

- Do not put grease, lard, oil, butter, shortening, etc., down the drain!
 Dispose of all cooking grease into the trash.
- Use the garbage disposal sparingly.
 When operating a garbage disposal, use plenty of water to flush everything down the drain. If your garbage disposal is old and no longer grinding the food small enough, please replace it with a new one.
