Our laundry machines are designed to clean articles of clothing, towels, sheets, etc.

We are finding that large items (bedspreads, comforters, etc.) are being put in the washers and dryers causing the machines to malfunction. Additionally, these items are too large for the machines, and will not be properly cleaned.

Please DO NOT put large items in the machines.

Should you have the need to clean large items, please use a local laundry mat that has specialty machines designed for this type of use.

SWIM DIAPERS A MUST!



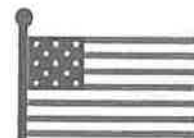
Children who are not toilet trained are required by law to wear "swim diapers" at all times while in the pool. Swim Diapers are designed to withstand water and contain solids. There are two types of swim diapers... reusable and disposable. For best results it is recommended to use both... disposable on the bottom and reusable on top is the best defense against spillage.

Children who are not toilet trained and not wearing proper swim diapers will be restricted from using the pool.

Note: anyone who is experiencing diarrhea is not allowed in the pool under any circumstances.

LAUNDRY ROOM WINDOW SCREENS

To allow ventilation in our laundry rooms, security screens have been installed. The sliding windows can be opened and the exhaust fan can be turned on by using the timer switch on the wall. **CAUTION: DO NOT OPEN THE EMERGENCY EXIT WINDOW UNLESS THERE IS AN EMERGENCY!**

WEST NILE VIRUS IN ORANGE COUNTY

The West Nile Virus has been detected in Santa Ana and continues to be a threat in Orange County.

Decrease risk of infection:

Recommended WNV precautions include:

- Emptying all standing water on your property to reduce areas in which mosquitoes may breed, including flower pots, pet bowls and other containers, which are prime breeding grounds for mosquitoes.
- Making sure your window and door screens are in good condition.
- Using insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, oil of lemon eucalyptus, or products containing IR3535, always following label directions
- Limiting outdoor activity at dawn and dusk, when mosquitoes are most active
- Wearing long-sleeved shirts and long pants when outdoors.
